Code of Ethics Briefing

The Code of Ethics formerly applied to MARTA's managerial level employees and Board of Directors. Today, it applies to all employees. 2013 amendments to The Code include:

- a) Monetary restriction on gifts (\$75)
- b) Natural Enforcement Discipline for officers and Board members
- c) One year prohibition a MARTA employee must wait a year before working with a company doing business with MARTA

The MARTA Code passed in 1973. There have been very few Code issues with Board members. Board members were cautioned regarding conduct when dealing with outside parties:

- When the Authority is in active procurement, there should be not conversation with third parties
- Avoid private dinners with any entities seeking business with MARTA
- Beware of gifts and favors
- Refer anyone with a great idea to the appropriate staff person
- Beware of taking positions with outside parties

Board members were encouraged to become thoroughly familiar with the Code.

Rail Car Fleet Truck Issues

As previously reported, there were two issues with the rail car fleet trucks:

- Transom tube cracks the trucks are currently under contract to be repaired
- Truck motor mount crack a fix is being developed and tested

A new issue has arisen:

- A truck frame crack was found in July 2015 — this issue is currently under investigation

- FFY 2015 2017 DBE Goal 30%

MARTA attained approximately 31% about 6 months into the program.

Dollars spent totaled approximately \$263M. At MARTA grows businesses, they are invited to become prime contractors. The goal is for businesses to grow out of DBE.
